ORDER NO. 87-160

RESCINDING WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR:

WILLIAMETTE-WESTERN CORPORATION
RICHMOND, CONTRA COSTA COUNTY

The California Regional Water Quality Control Board, San Francisco Bay Region (hereinafter Board) finds that:

1. Water Code Section 13263(e) and the State Board's regulations (Title 23, CAC, Section 2232.2) require the Board to review waste discharge requirements periodically and determine if the requirements are adequate or necessary.
2. In February, 1977, the Board adopted Order 77-8 prescribing requirements for Williamette-Western Corporation's (hereinafter discharger) wastewater overflow from a barge used for hydraulic sand dredging in Suisun Bay between Stake Point and Middle Ground Island, Solano County.
3. The discharger has discontinued this operation and has no plans to continue it in the future.
4. This Order will rescind the requirements which permit the discharger to discharge wastewater overflow. Adoption of this Order is exempt from provisions of Chapter 3 (commencing with Section 21100) of Division 13 of the Public Resources Code (CEQA) pursuant to Section 13389 of the California Water Code.
5. The discharger and interested agencies and persons have been notified of the Board's intent to rescind requirements permitting the discharger to discharge wastewater overflow, and have been provided with the opportunity for a public hearing and the opportunity to submit their written views and recommendations.

6. The Board, in a public hearing, has heard and considered all comments pertaining to the rescission of wastewater discharge requirements.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT: This Board's Order No. 77-8 is rescinded.
